Replying to your letter 26th ultimo,
I requested my attorneys to write to Mr. Nelles and
give him detailed information as to why my case involves
a legal point worth testing. Mr. Whitehead informed me
that they wrote to Mr. Nelles. I trust that the
statement has been received and that you will take some
action.

Thus far, the case cost me \$299. That
included everything -- court costs and attorney fees. I
had to pay nearly all of this; all except \$36.50 donated
by Socialists.

Whitehead and Vogl told me that the case
will cost approximately \$500.00 to take it as far as the
circuit court of appeals. This amount includes everything.
Most of it, court costs. Attorneys are practically donating
their services, for they are giving their time at cost, while,
work that provides greater remuneration awaits their attention.

Expensive fight. But, I believe it is worth
all it will cost.

If you see fit to assist me, I trust you will
do so soon as convenient. Must pay court costs as they complete
their work.
